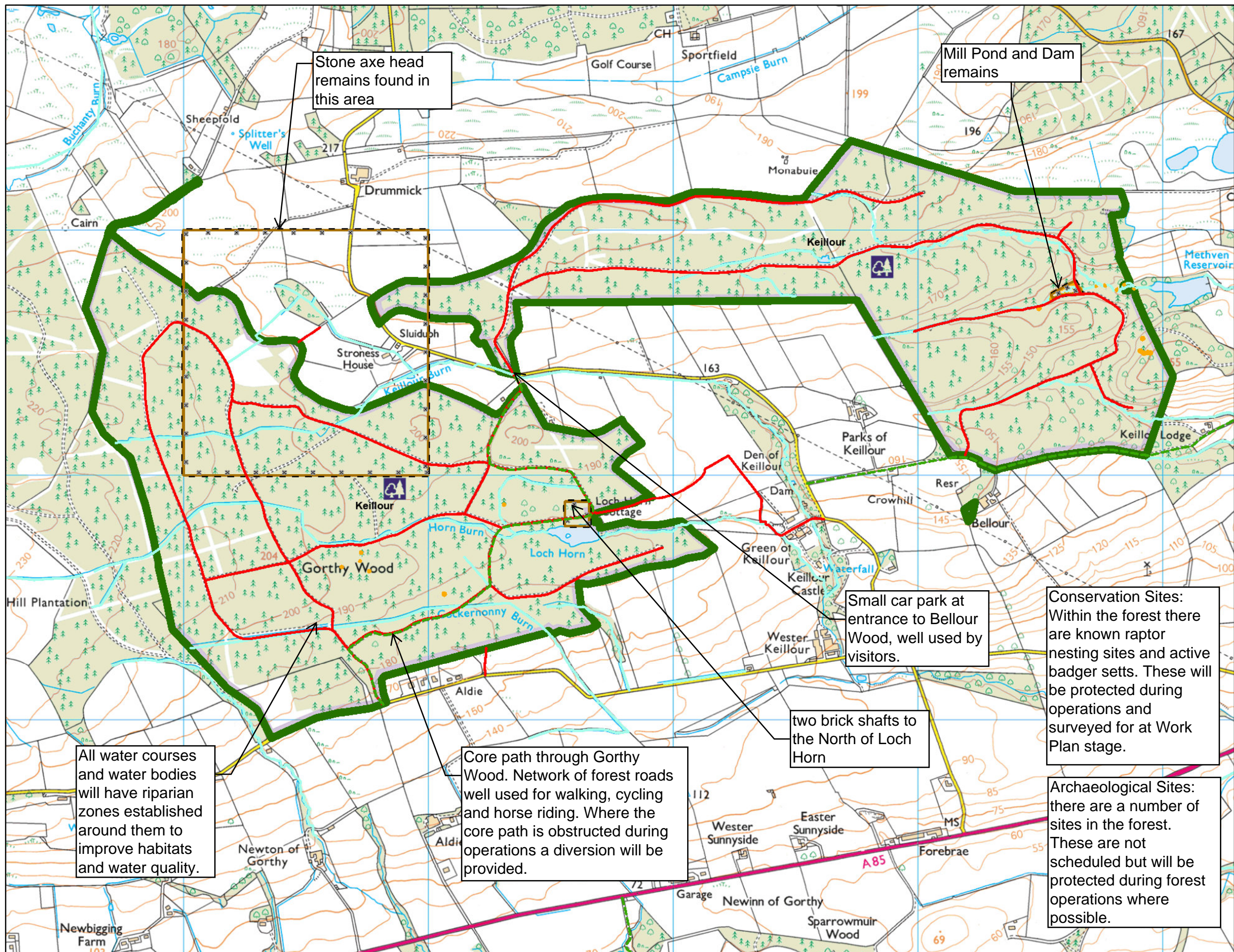

Small car park at entrance to Bellour Wood, well used by visitors.

Conservation Sites: Within the forest there are known raptor nesting sites and active badger sets. These will be protected during operations and surveyed for at Work Plan stage.

Archaeological Sites: there are a number of sites in the forest. These are not scheduled but will be protected during forest operations where possible.

All water courses and water bodies will have riparian zones established around them to improve habitats and water quality.

Core path through Gorthy Wood. Network of forest roads well used for walking, cycling and horse riding. Where the core path is obstructed during operations a diversion will be provided.
