Forth Mosses LMP – Summary of Proposals

Forth Mosses Land Management Plan combines two previously separate plan areas of Flanders Moss and Cardross between the villages of Buchlyvie and Port of Menteith within the Stirling Local Authority area. Most of the Cardross area is also within Loch Lomond and The Trossachs National Park. The plan covers a range of forest management and habitat types within a lowland peatland and basin landscape. The intention of this plan is to enhance the important function of carbon capture and flood risk mitigation through peatland restoration at Flanders whilst also addressing the need to mitigate the spread of *Phytophthora ramorum* through minor felling and thinning at Cardross.

This plan reduces significantly reduces the area of Sitka spruce and larch species and sees the area of native broadleaves area and restored open habitat peatland increase.
