FOREST HOLIDAYS
Proposed site for 56 new holiday cabins

VENLAW WOOD
Part of prominent woodland on Venlaw Hill on the north side of Peebles - neighbouring woodland is 'common land' previously managed as a community woodland.

PEEBLES
Population c.9000

RIVER TWEED SSSI/SAC
All watercourses feed into the River Tweed Special Conservation Area. Many are important for salmon and trout spawning.

JANET'S BRAE
Ancient woodland site (Long established of plantation origin)

RECREATION
World class 7 Stanes mountain bike trails as well as walking trails, Go Ape tree top course, Tweed Valley Osprey Project, bike shop/hire and cafe.

LANDSCAPE
These forests dominated much of the local landscape and provide a backdrop to local communities. Cademuir borders with Upper Tweeddale National Scenic Area to the west. The LMP area is within Tweed Valley and Tweedsmuir Uplands Local Landscape Areas.

TIMBER PRODUCTION
The forests of the Tweed Valley are an important resource of predominantly softwood for the timber industry in South Scotland.

NATURAL RESERVES
Natural Reserves in Cardrona and Glentress designated in 2016 to be reviewed 2021

TREE HEALTH
Plant diseases and pests are a threat to the forests in the Tweed Valley. Of particular concern are Phytophthora ramorum that has already infected larch in Glentress and Traquair Forests, and ash dieback which is now widespread.

DEER MANAGEMENT
Roe deer present throughout LMP area at moderate population levels. Sika deer are abundant in Cardrona and spreading through the forests on the south side of the River Tweed.

SPECIES CONSERVATION
The forests and open habitats provide valuable habitat for a variety of protected and other animal and bird species. Protected raptor species include goshawk and osprey. Red squirrels are present throughout the Tweed Valley despite an abundance of grey squirrels. Pine marten are becoming more abundant. Badgers are abundant throughout the valley.

ANDERSON PLOTS
Continuous Cover Forestry trials established in 1950s by Professor Anderson of Edinburgh University

BLACK GROUSE AREA
Several black grouse lek sites between Glentress forest boundary and Leithen Water

LANDSCAPE
Forest restructuring yet to start in the east side of Glentress - steep slopes dominated by Sitka spruce.

GREEN HILL SETTLEMENT
Scheduled ancient monument

LANDSCAPE
'Awkward' boundary between Glentress and Nether Horsburgh

NETHER HORSBURGH
Separate LMP for woodland creation project - planted 2019

PRIVATE WATER SUPPLIES
Several private water supplies in Cardrona and Glentress

HERITAGE AND ARCHAEOLOGY
Scheduled monuments and other sites of historical and archaeological interest are found throughout the Tweed Valley.

RECREATION
Cademuir Car park, walking and multi-user trails, and some unofficial mountain bike trails.

LANDSCAPE
Kailzie Garden and Designed Landscape

RECREATION AND TOURISM
Tweed Valley Forest Park provides an important setting for formal recreation facilities and informal access for walking, horse riding, cycling and other activities. Many local businesses are dependent on the recreation activities in these Forest Parks.
