



Water pipelines and several private water supply points have been identified in the LMP area. There is potential for more water supply points to be present.

Red Squirrel Stronghold - risk of fragmenting the red squirrel habitat

Windblow is present throughout the LMP area.

Cairngorms National Park: LMP may need to consider different policy objectives associated with the national park status.

The LMP area has access to agreed timber transport routes.

Unscheduled heritage features are present throughout LMP area

Neighbouring woodland is adjacent to the LMP area. Discussion with neighbouring landowners concerning management is required to avoid adjacency issues.

Inactive powerline wayleave.

Lodgepole pine present throughout LMP area in mixtures - LMP area has suffered from DNB in the past could present an issue in the future.

Twinflower is present within the the LMP area.

Scheduled Monument: Newe's Craig must be kept open

ScotWays Right of Way: Windblow is impeding a section of this claimed route.

Area of Long Established Woodland of plantation origin run across the northern strip of the block.

Larch present throughout the LMP area in mixtures - risk of SPHN in the future.

The LMP area is situated in the Cairngorm Straths' Environmentally Sensitive Area.

There is potential for flood risk management to reduce run off on Sloganbuian Burn, Deskry Water and Deuchrie Burn.

Potential Areas for Peatland Restoration

A quarry expansion is required to facilitate planned operations.

The native broadleaved component is low across the LMP area and needs to be increased to meet the UKFS.

Areas of second rotation Sitka spruce appear to be suffering from check.

Herbivore browsing impact: Issue of deer and neighbouring sheep browsing restock sites due to the deteriorating fence condition.

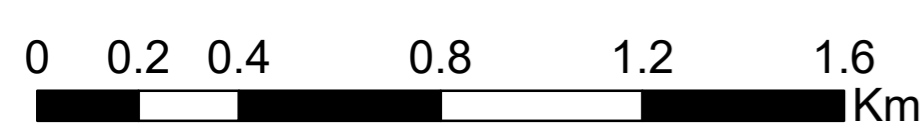
