



Felling of exotic conifer to reduce non native seeding potential within the Dundreggan Pinewood Buffer Zone

Management of forest under CCF will provide shelter benefits to local residents & maintain a woodland character

Early removal of Lodge pole pine, partly unsuitable for conventional harvesting - target for combination of conventional harvesting & Fell to Recycle or Mulching

Proposed upgrade to the forest road will allow the majority of future timber traffic to access the A82 through the Rubha ban entrance. A detailed Appropriate assessment will be undertaken for works adjacent to the SAC

Smaller DNB felling coupes at a closer phasing will reduce the associated impact of harvesting, whilst optimising timber recovery. Any crop adjacency in the commercial forest will be addressed through manipulation of restock timing.

Small scale felling coupes around Torr Dhuin, in keeping with the character of the landscape
