### **Jubilee Trail**



Experience the charms of Kinnoull Hill without climbing to the summit on this short loop through varied pine, beech and spruce forest that is alive with birdsong.

Wide, firm and largely smooth surface throughout. Moderate slopes. Some patches may be slightly muddy. Includes a road crossing.

# **Deuchny Trail** 000

Follow in the footsteps of ancient kings on this circuit of Deuchny Wood that has great views across the Perthshire countryside.

Mostly firm gravel surface with some uneven and grassy sections. One long fairly steep slope. Includes three wide gates.
