Goirtean nán Craobh – Field of the trees
Creag Liath – Grey crag
Allt na Molaich – Rough burn
Cisteachan dubhe – Black chest/coffin
Allt Glas Dhoire Mor – Big grey burn of the Oak thicket
Cam Bhealach – Crooked mountain pass
Dearg Allt – Red burn
Kilfinnan – Finnan's Church/Cemetery
Sidhean Mor – Big hill of the fairy
Meall na Teanga – Hill of the tongue
Coire Glas – Grey corrie
Sròn Bhreac – Spotted nose/Nose of the trout
Meall Odhar – Yellow mound
